“Your thoughts of God are too human”

- Letter from Luther to Erasmus

### I. Introduction

#### A. God has majesty.

- The most common Hebrew word translated majesty (מִיָּהוּ) carries the following meaning:
  - Weight, power, splendor, majesty
  - Thunder, snorting horse, olive tree
  - God, king, Messiah, Moses
- The most common Greek word translated majesty (μεγαλωσύνη) carries the following meaning:
  - Greatness, majesty

#### B. God is The Majesty.

### II. The One without limits. (Psalm 139)

A. There is no limit to God’s knowledge. (vv. 1-6, 23 & 24)

B. There is no limit to God’s presence. (vv. 7-12)

C. There is no limit to God’s power. (vv. 13-22)

III. The incomparable One. (Isaiah 40)

A. Incomparable in His actions. (vv. 1-12)

1. His actions of judgment.
2. His actions of comfort.
3. His actions of creation.

B. Incomparable in His sovereignty. (vv. 13-31)

1. His sovereignty over all counsel.
2. His sovereignty over all nations (even enemies).
3. His sovereignty over all other “gods.”
4. His sovereignty over all humanity (even leaders).
5. His sovereignty over all creation.

- “Behold your God!” – He is the only One truly Majestic.

IV. Though Majestic He is Personal.

A. He formed us from the womb. (Psalm 139:13)

B. He cares for us as our Great Shepherd. (Isaiah 40:11)

C. He desires fellowship with His children. (Genesis 3:8,9; Hebrews 4:16; 1 John 1:1-3)
