## Finding A Job On The Internet Irving Weiner, Employment Assistance Coordinator, Region 1

For many of today's professionals the Internet is becoming great fishing hole for a new job. The swiftly growing popularity and accessibility of the 'Net, particularly the World Wide Web, have made it invaluable to our less fortunate who are presently searching for a new position, be it entry level or senior slot levels. At the 1995 PACE

Conference, the EAC workshop highlighted electronic job search techniques, specifically the IEEE-USA Job Listing Service.

To illustrate some of the many on-line opportunities for job seekers, EAC brought up on line the National Job Listing Service. These listings on the Internet are by state, covering the six USA regions in separate auto-response files. A seventh file covers nation wide and international listings. Any of these auto-response files can be accessed by members merely by sending a message to the E-mail address of the desired file - the text message can simply be "hello" or nothing at all. The auto-response file requested is turned around to your "E-mail box". There is no fax machine or phone answering machine or "snail mail" to worry about. Once the selected file is in your E-mail box, you can read it or download it to a word processing program and perform "key word" searches on the information. Copied to floppies, it can be distributed to other members or printed out and posted at your local Job Bank meetings.

The JLS is but one electronic job search tool, there are many other similar sources out there on the 'Net. Listed below are a group of Web sites that contain references to employment.

### Are You Tired of ..... Clifford Pope

Changing one's E-mail address is a somewhat painful process. We must notify friends and colleagues and redo business cards. An increasing number of us are either changing companies, changing Internet providers, or both. The IEEE offers a great service to its members — an E-mail alias. After an application has been processed by the IEEE, E-mail directed to your new address is automatically forwarded to the real address you specify. For example, if you sent me an E-mail message at c.pope@ieee.org the

message will arrive at popec@core.ma.ultranet.com. If I should change Internet provider, then I will send a message to IEEE to have my E-mail forwarded to the new address. No need to tell others about the change. Also, the alias is an easy one to remember.

The most convenient way to apply for the alias is at http://www.ieee.org (IEEE's web home page) and follow the links to "electronic communications services" to "directory services (aliases)" or "E-mail alias services." You will find instructions on how to apply for an alias at the bottom of the page. In these instructions is a sentence that begins: "If you are an IEEE volunteer." Ignore this phrase.
