The Trinity Church is located at 23 Main Street in Northbrough, Mass. (in Northbrough, Main Street is also Route 20), one block east from Northbrough Center. Northbrough Center is at the intersections of Main Street, Route 135, and Church Street.

From Northbrough Center, head east for one block and take the first left after the railroad tracks. This left will be between an Exxon gas station on the left and the "Trinity Church" on the right. Take your first right into the parking area of the Trinity Church and enter the church from the back door off the parking lot. Northboro Center is centrally located:

From the north or Worcester: Take Route 290 to the "Church Street" exit and head south, follow Church Street to Northbrough Center. From the east, this is the second set of exits from Route 495 and a left turn at the bottom of the exit ramp. From the west, this is the exit after the Route 140 exits in Shrewsbury and a turn right at the bottom of the exit ramp.

From Marlboro: Follow Route 20 East to Northbrough Center.

From Westbrough: Take Route 9 to the "Route 135 North" exit and follow to Northbrough Center.

From Shrewsbury: Follow Route 20 East to Northbrough Center.

I hope to see many of you there. Registration is not required but I really want to get some idea of how many of you will be attending so we can have sufficient refreshments. I want this to be a great time for all. If you know

Delphi 3.0

Delphi 3.0, scheduled for release in the second quarter of this year, includes many significant additions and enhancements. Active Insight, Delphi 3.0's seamless integration of ActiveX consists of four ActiveX technologies for client-side development. Packages, a compiler enhancement that provides the option of compiling an exe separate from its accompanying dlls, can produce very small client applications and lays the foundation for distributed computing. Broker technologies, Delphi 3.0's server-side support for multitier client/server application development consists of four technologies: Remote Data, Business Object, Constraint, and Web brokers.

This months meeting will review these and many other enhancements to Delphi 3.0 including enhanced database access, Visual Component Library extensions including decision support and data analysis components, Code Insight, and many additions to the integrated development environment.
