## OSHA joins Cheney at undisclosed location

RICH KILLED AT WORK 0 "OSHA is missing," reports Peg Seminario AFL safety director. The Federal Agency that protects workers has been moved to an undisclosed location to avoid further contact with members of the teachers union, recently exposed as a terrorist organization by the Bush Administration.

The move is easy for the agency since the Bush administration has worked for three years to keep the agency from doing anything. Safety regulation and workplace inspections have been replaced with recommendations and 'voluntary compliance'.

**"We like it like that,"** said Chris Tampio of National Association of Manufacturers (NAM), "You don't always have to have big regulations with a threat of enforcement."

The Bush administration denied that the Drug Enforcement Agency would follow OSHA's lead and switch from enforcing drug laws to informing drug users how to avoid enforcement.

OSHA Administrator John Henshaw enthusiastically defended the cost saving decision to never again help workers. "We must not let others distract us from our mission and objectives. The biggest challenge will be to stay the course."

Earlier this year OSHA stopped members of the National Education Association and other terrorist organizations affiliated with the AFL-CIO from accessing the OSHA website on workplace inspections. This highly sensitive, public domain, data is now only available from 8 am to 6 pm (EST) from Monday through Friday when most workers cannot use it.

OSHA will change to meet the security demands of the Homeland, announced Henshaw, responding to the Bush Administration determination that unions are terrorist organizations. Workplace inspectors will be replaced with web designers and internet librarians. OSHA will become the first Federal Virtual Agency, existing only as a website virtuallyosha.gov.
