Military Service: April 19, 1775 Capt. Parkers Company, was a private in a detachment from Lexington Alarm Co., commanded by Capt. Edmund Monro: service 5 days; detachment reported on command at Cambridge from May 16 to May 20, 1775, by order of committee of Safety; also Capt. John Bridge's co., Col. Eleazer Brook's regt.; service from March 4 to March 8, 1776, 5 days; company stationed in Roxbury.

Official record of a ballot by the House of Representatives, dated April 27 1776; said Harrington chosen Adjutant, 3d Middlesex Co. regt. Of Mass. Militia; appointment concurred in by Council April 27, 1776; reported commissioned April 27, 1776.

1790 Censes: one male over 16, one male under 16, 3 females, no slaves

Characters history summary: It is possible the family moved to Boston in the 1790's
